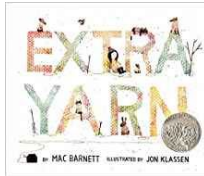

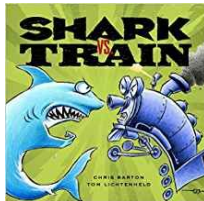

***Extra Yarn* (2013 Caldecott Honor)**

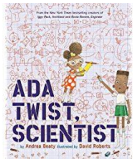
Annabelle's yarn never runs out, and she enjoys knitting things for everyone. But then the archduke decides he wants the yarn for himself!

Shark vs. Train

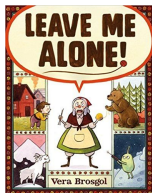
A shark and a train compete in a series of contests on a seesaw, in hot air balloons, bowling,, playing sports, and more.

Ada Twist, Scientist

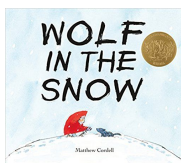
Ada Twist is a very curious girl who asks questions, performs experiments and doesn't give up!

***Leave me Alone!* (2017 Caldecott Honor)**

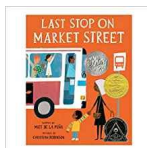
Grandmother wants to be left alone to finish the knitting and so she leaves her house to journey to the moon and beyond.

A girl is lost in a snowstorm. A wolf cub is lost, too. How will they find their way home?

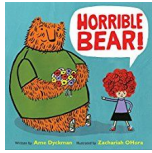

When Bear breaks a little girl’s kite, she thinks he is a “horrible bear!”... Until she makes a mistake of her own.



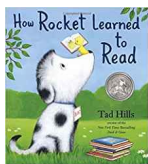
Feiffer, Jules ***Bark, George***

Hills, Tad ***How Rocket Learned to Read****

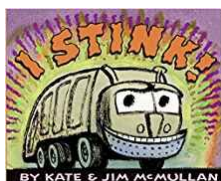
Rocket the dog doesn’t think he needs to learn how to read, but his teacher, a little yellow bird, opens his mind and imagination to the wonders of books and reading.

A garbage truck describes his day complete with lots of great illustrations, sound effects, and an A-Z alphabet list of garbage items.

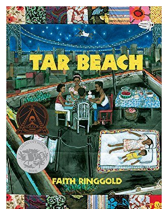
Novak, B.J. ***The Book With No Pictures***

This book really doesn't have any pictures, but the reader is required to say out loud all the silly words that are written.



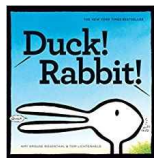
Pinkwater, Daniel ***The Big Orange Splot***

Sima, Jessie ***Not Quite Narwhal***

Heartwarming story of a young unicorn who was born under the sea to a family of narwhals.



Stein, David Ezra ***Interrupting Chicken* (2011 Caldecott Honor)**

Little Red Chicken wants Papa to read her a bedtime story, but interrupts him almost as soon as he begins each tale.



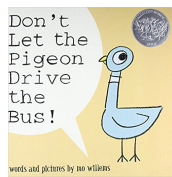
Thomas, Jan ***Rhyming Dust Bunnies****

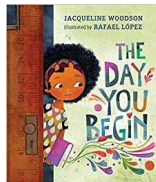
Watt, Melanie ***Scaredy Squirrel at the Beach* ***

Woodson, Jacquelyn ***The Day You Begin***

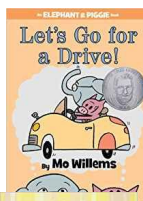
A heartwarming story about having the courage to connect with those around you.

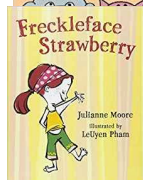
Capucilli, Alyssa ***Biscuit Wants to Play****

Gerald and Piggy make plans to go for a ride!



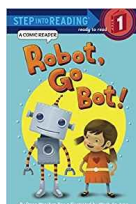
Moore, Julianne ***Freckleface Strawberry: Loose Tooth!****

A young boy determines to rescue a poor baby dragon who is being used by a group of lazy wild animals to ferry them across the river on Wild Island.



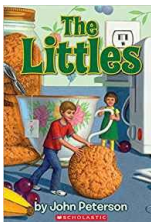
Jenkins, Emily ***Toys Go Out****
